The Sentencing Project recently released the [first issue](#) of a project addressing youth diversion in the criminal-justice system. This project highlights continued efforts to reform juvenile-justice practices, given research that shows that youth diverted from the justice system are less likely to be arrested for future offenses and more likely to find success in education than youth who are prosecuted in juvenile court.
